In addition, Chad and Dan have also found a great opportunity to minister through chaplaincy at a local university. This has brought the opportunities to speak to classes on topics like "Death, Dying and Spirituality." They recently hosted a free morning tea where students could meet and ask questions. The event proved so successful that they were nearly out of food halfway through the morning. Hardly a week goes by that we do not have a significant conversation with someone there about Christ, something which we have been praying for a long time. God is at work!
